The 'unforgettable' of the trip:

- **Senoufo** ancestral traditions and craft villages around **Korhogo**
- The savannahs of the **Malinké** and **Peulh** farmers in **Boundiali** and **Odienné**
- The thatched and mud villages, the Yacouba and Wé masks, the Dan liana bridges
- The impressive **Yamoussoukro** basilica and the evolutions of the Goly mask of the **Baulé**
- Abidjan the cosmopolitan, with its skyline over the Ebrié Lagoon
- The colonial decadence of **Grand Bassam** and its palm-fringed beach
- The **Abissa festival***, celebrations of the N'zima Kotoko











Day 1: Thursday 23 October Outward flight/Abidjan (ABJ)

Flight to Abidjan. On arrival, transfer to Hotel Onomo or similar and overnight stay in a double room with services.

Day 2: Friday 24 October Abidjan (ABJ)/Domestic Flight/Korhogo (HGO)

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to the airport for the Air Cote d'Ivoire flight to Korhogo (HGO). On arrival meeting with the Kanaga Africa Tours staff and accommodation at Hotel La Rose Blanche or similar. Assistance for the exchange of euros and for the possible purchase of a local phone card. We then visit the Koko woodcarvers' quarter, the women's cooperative that makes shea butter, and the craft market with the famous canvases that also inspired Pablo Picasso. Overnight stay in a double room with services.



After breakfast, the whole day is dedicated to visiting PAYS SENOUFO in the surroundings of KORHOGO: the animist sanctuary of the Shienlow stone, where the faithful regularly perform animal sacrifices, the granite artisanal mines, the blacksmiths' village of KONI, where the art of the forgerons, masters of fire, is perpetuated. Lunch in a restaurant. In the afternoon, visit the village of KAPELE, where hand-painted terracotta beads are made by craftsmen to produce jewellery, and WARANIENE', famous for its weavers. Here we will witness the BOLOYE DANCE, also known as the 'panther dance', which is part of the initiation rituals of the Poro of the Senoufo ethnic group. Overnight stay at the hotel.

Day 4: Sunday 26 October

Korhogo/Boundiali/Odienne

After breakfast, visit NIOFOINS, a typical village with its tapered Senoufo granaries, to admire its conical, pointed fetish houses, up to 5 metres high. Departure for BOUNDIALI, where in a village we will witness the NGORO dance, part of the young girls' initiations. Lunch in a restaurant. This is followed by a visit to a PEULH VILLAGE, an ethnic group of nomadic herdsmen of Nilotic origin present throughout the Sahél, characterised by their wide-brimmed hats and the tattooing on the lips of married women. Continuation to ODIENNE, accommodation at the Hotel des Frontieres or similar, overnight stay in a double room with services.



Breakfast and transfer to a MANDING VILLAGE, where we will attend a mask release and traditional warrior dances. Afterwards, departure in a southerly direction to TOUBA, the heart of PAYS YACOUBA, lunch in a restaurant. In the afternoon, in a traditional village, we will witness the YACOUBA MASKS coming out of the sacred forest, including the one on stilts Gue Gblen, characteristic for its acrobatic qualities. Continuation to Man, accommodation at Hotel Les Cascades or similar and overnight stay in a double room with services.

Day 6: Tuesday 28 October Man/Danane/Man

After breakfast, depart for DANANE towards the border with Liberia, a region inhabited by the DAN and characterised by its liana bridges over the Bandama River, said to have been created by forest spirits. Return to MAN and lunch in a restaurant. In the afternoon, we depart for FACOBLY, where in a small VILLAGE WE' will be able to watch an acrobatic performance by the 'jongleurs de l'Ouest', and an exit of the GUERE' MASKS from the sacred forest. Return to Man and overnight at the hotel.

Day 7: Wednesday 29 October

Man/Daloa/Yamoussoukro

After breakfast transfer to Daloa, lunch in a restaurant. In the afternoon, we continue to the capital, stopping en route at a cocoa plantation, where we learn the secrets of the country's main export product. Arrival in Yamoussoukro where we can watch the feeding of the sacred caimans in front of the presidential palace (weather permitting). Accommodation at the Hotel President or similar and overnight stay in a double room with services.

Day 8: Thursday 30 October

Yamoussoukro/Abidjan

After breakfast we depart for a VILLAGE BAOULE' where we can admire the work of the kita weavers and participate in the GOLY MASK DANCE. Return to YAMOUSSOUKRO (also known as 'Yakro') for lunch in a restaurant. In the early afternoon we visit the basilica of Notre Dame de la Paix, the largest Christian religious building in the world, modelled on St Peter's in Rome and strongly desired by Ivorian President Felix Houphouet-Boigny. Continuation to Abidjan, accommodation at the Grand Hotel or similar and overnight in a double room with services.

Day 9: Friday 31 October

Abidjan/Grand Bassam (Abissa)

After breakfast, visit ABIDJAN, the chaotic and cosmopolitan economic centre of the country, characterised by being built on a series of islands on the Ebrié lagoon connected by bridges. City tour of the Plateau district including the Cathedral, designed by Italian architect Aldo Spirito, and the ethnographic museum with its enviable collection of masks. Lunch in a restaurant and continuation along the coast to GRAND BASSAM, afternoon dedicated to the participation in the ABISSA* FESTIVAL of the people N'zima Kotoko, celebrations in honour of King Tanoe Amon, with songs, dances and parades in the traditional dress of this ethnic group of Akan origin. Accommodation at the Hotel Etoile du Sud or similar and overnight stay in a double room with services.

Day 10: Saturday 01 November Grand Bassam (Abissa)/Abidjan

After breakfast, visit GRAND BASSAM, the former colonial capital at the time of the French occupation, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We stroll through the sleepy streets of the quartier de France, dotted with decadent vestiges such as the palace of Governor Binger's palace, which houses the costume museum that we will visit, and the old post office and customs house. Participate in the apotheosis of the ABISSA* FESTIVAL, the king's exit from the royal palace on a canopy from which he distributes gifts and blessings to the population. Lunch in a maguis on the lagoon. Time at leisure for shopping in craft boutiques (masks, ceramics, paintings, ...). Transfer to Abidian, some rooms in day use at the Hotel Onomo or similar. Transfer to the airport, end of services.
